eng Chia University, established in 1961, is located in Taichung City, Taiwan. Taichung City occupies a large portion of the Taichung basin. The area surrounding Taichung City is rich in tourism and getaway opportunities ranging from windsurfing, to historical sites, to hot spring, to stunning hiking trails. The city is generally regarded as having one of the most agreeable climates all throughout the year. Feng Chia Night Market is located adjacent to Feng Chia University, in northern Taichung's XiTun District. In recent years, this busy, thriving area has become the city's most popular night market, particularly among university students and younger adults.

Feng Chia University is famous nationwide for building up an e-campus, using the most advanced and

integrated information technology to enhance teaching, research and administration. It is among the first universities in Taiwan that provide high-speed connections to reach to the world, and build up a campus-wide wireless network to facilitate the any-time any-where learning environment.

Currently Feng Chia University takes around 20,000 graduate and undergraduate students yearly in its nine Colleges (Business, Finance, Construction & Development, Engineering, Humanities & Social Sciences, Sciences, Information & Electrical Engineering, School of Management Development and International School of Technology and Management), offering 40 Bachelor's degree programs, 60 Master's degree programs, and 14 doctoral degree programs.

Courses

This is a four-week summer program. You will take not only the academic courses with three credits but also survival Chinese and cultural classes with one credit earned. It also offers an opportunity to make new friends around the world.

Students choose one of three themes:

TAIWANESE CULTURE: The culture of Taiwan is a blend of aboriginal cultures, Taiwanese folk cultures, Chinese classical culture, and Western-influenced modern culture, which are often perceived in both traditional and modern understandings. Over four-fifths of Taiwanese are descendants of Han Chinese settlers from southeastern China. The island's original inhabitants, who are related to Malayo-Polynesian peoples of Southeast Asia, have lived on the island for thousands of years. Through the lectures, students will learn the history, life styles, religions, architectures, traditional & modern arts, foods in Taiwan.

BRAND & INNOVATION: The interactive program focuses on introducing the types of business models and innovation development in Taiwan. Students will learn agriculture innovation in the rural community, the evolution of marketing best-practice for market research, development and placement of new products, brand development strategy & innovation, etc. Furthermore, students will visit several world known companies to receive a deeper approach of Taiwan world class facilities, for example, Franz Collection Inc and Ferro-Carbon.

GREEN LIFE: This program provides the knowledge of green life, including renewable energy technology, low-carbon life and corporate social responsibility (CSR). The innovative green technologies of bioenergy production, microbial fuel cell, solar, nanotechnology, and micro hydropower will be introduced and practiced. In addition, the low-carbon life lecture will introduce the carbon dioxide emission in your daily life and play the Taiwan's carbon footprint Monopoly. Two field trips for green energy allows you to experience the bioenergy, solar energy and wind power energy plants in Taiwan.
